




### Who we are?

The Institute of Regional Studies -INER for their initials in Spanish- is an academic unit of the Universidad de Antioquia, created in 1989 for the production of new knowledge about the territorial realities of the department of Antioquia and the contribution to the understanding of university regionalization.

The INER is substantiated on interdisciplinary research and creative and inclusive work with participatory methodologies, contributing to social science debates and producing relevant inputs for territorial public policies.

In 1996 the INER began its teaching processes with the implementation of the Specialization in Theories, Methods and Techniques in Social Research. The master's degree was opened in 2006 in Socio-Spatial Studies and since 2016 started the process of creating a Phd in Socio-Spatial Studies.
